## WHAT DOES FIRST COMMUNITY CREDIT UNION

DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

#### Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

#### What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and income
- Account balances and payment history
- Credit history and credit scores

#### How?

All financial companies need to share members' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their members' personal information; the reasons First Community Credit Union chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do		
How does <b>First Community Credit Union</b> protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.	
How does <b>First Community Credit Union</b> collect my personal information?	<ul> <li>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</li> <li>Open an account or deposit money</li> <li>Apply for a loan or pay your bills</li> <li>Use your debit or credit card</li> <li>We also collect your personal information from others such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.</li> </ul>	
Why can't I limit all sharing?	<ul> <li>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</li> <li>sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your creditworthiness</li> <li>affiliates from using your information to market to you</li> <li>sharing for non-affiliates to market to you</li> <li>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.</li> </ul>	
What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account - unless you tell us otherwise.	
Definitions		
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies.  First Community Credit Union's affiliates include:  First Community Ventures, LLC, First Community Land Ventures, LLC, and Texas Business Lenders Group, LLC	
Non-affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies.  Non-affiliates we share with can include: mortgage companies, insurance companies, direct marketing companies, and other financial service providers.	
Joint Marketing	A formal agreement between non-affiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.  Our Joint Marketing partners include: financial services companies, insurance companies, investment companies, and credit card service companies.
